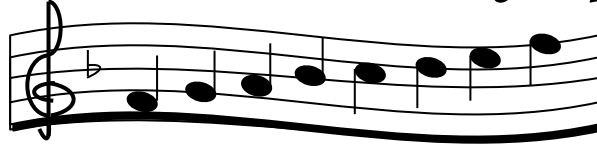

Lucinda Dalrymple received her B.S. from the University of Western Ontario, her B. Mus. from McGill University in Montreal, her Kodály certification, and a Master's degree in Education from Seattle Pacific University. Lucinda is a music specialist at The Evergreen School, Director of Summer Fun, a visual and performing arts camp for children, and director of Coughlan Academies, a music school, serving students in Ballard and Sammamish. She is past-President of Northwest Kodály Educators and Western Division president-elect of OAKE. She has presented sessions in early childhood music education for that organization.



Kelly Foster Griffin is a National Board Certified Teacher and received her B.A. of Music Education from Pacific Lutheran University, her Kodály certification from Kodály Musical Training Institute, University of Hartford and her MA of Music Education with Kodály Emphasis from Holy Names University. She has taught K-6 Music for 27 years at Moorlands Elementary in the Northshore School District. Kelly Foster Griffin has served as president of the Northwest Kodály Educators (2000-02), and Western Division president (2008-10) and National president elect/president/past president (2010-16) of the Organization of American Kodály Educators. Kelly Foster Griffin has taught workshops and demonstration lessons at regional and national conferences in the United States and in Canada.



Megan Oberfield instructs singers and ringers of all ages in a variety of contexts. She currently teaches choir and general music in Tacoma Public Schools, is Music Director for Puget Sound Revels, where she orchestrates a variety of seasonal celebrations throughout the year, culminating in The Christmas Revels, and is the Artistic Director for the non-profit South Sound Choir Academy, home to Tacoma Singing Society, South Sound Youth Choir and Tacoma Ringing Society. She is a graduate of Westminster Choir College where she studied Music Education and Voice, and holds a Master of Music Education, Kodály Emphasis, from Silver Lake College.
